#### What's with the bookends?

Your safety as an instructor is always our number one concern both on the snow and inside the locker room. This year we have added several safety measures in the locker room including new mats in the gear room, a fan for the waxing bench and recently the orange stools to help people get gear from on top of lockers. To add to these items we are also installing bookends on the tops of the lockers. These are designed to help limit the risk of boots from coming off the sides of lockers and causing a potential hazard.
