Did you know?



There are two railroad tunnels that run under Stevens Pass. The original tunnel was 2.63 miles long and opened in 1900 to avoid problems caused by heavy winter snowfall. The current tunnel is 7.8 miles in length and entered service in 1929. The current tunnel connects Berne in Chelan County and Scenic Hot Springs in King County and is the longest railroad tunnel in the United States.
