Did You Know?

Stevens Pass is named after John Frank Stevens, the first non-indigenous person to discover it. Native Americans familiar with the area knew of the pass, although very little is known about Native American routes through the mountains. As an engineer for The Great Northern Railroad, Stevens built over a thousand miles of railroad, including the original <u>Cascade</u> <u>Tunnel</u>. <u>Stevens Pass</u> in the <u>Cascade Range</u> was named for him. (Most other <u>Pacific</u> <u>Northwest</u> landmarks with the word "Stevens" are named after <u>Isaac Stevens</u>, who is of no relation.) In 1905, John Frank Stevens was hired by <u>Theodore Roosevelt</u> as chief engineer on the <u>Panama Canal</u>.
