## TREE WELL & DEEP SNOW ACCIDENT PREVENTION



With all of the new snow over the last few weeks, it is wise to consider safety issues that arise with deep snow conditions. A tree well or snow immersion suffocation accident can happen when a skier or snowboarder falls – usually headfirst – into a tree well or deep loose snow and becomes immobilized and trapped under the snow and suffocates.
