First Day – Tips for Success

Onboarding and first days are coming up fast for all of us. For many, the first day you visit the Ski and Snowboard School this season will be before the resort is open. Therefore, you may be coming up before all our operational departments are in full swing. Here are some things to consider:

- Check the weather. Always.
- Check the highway status. Always
- Before we open for the winter, you can park in A lot the main lot In front of the resort. After we open, you must park in "Employee Parking" which is Lot D (just past the parking building across the street.)
- Dress in layers and expect it to be cold and wet
- Wear boots. Seriously. Waterproof/Rubber and tall are best.
- Follow established, cleared, groomed or tracked paths through the snow. The safest path may not be the shortest.
- Walk with caution, keep hands free whenever you can and consider a ski pole for a third point of contact. Walk like a penguin if it is icy!
- Snacks/water... it can be a long ride for some and the concessions are not yet open. Make sure to take care of yourself and pack what you need for a good drive.
