Safety Tip

As we dive into the heart of the ski season, it's essential to be prepared for all kinds of snow conditions. Mother Nature can be unpredictable, and skiing on poor snow requires some extra caution and know-how. Here are some tips to keep everyone safe on the slopes:

Adjust Your Speed: In icy or slushy conditions, it's crucial to ski/ride at a controlled speed. Slow down, especially on steeper slopes and, be prepared to react to unexpected changes in terrain.

Maintain Equipment: Check your gear regularly, paying attention to your edges and bindings. Properly maintained gear can make a significant difference when tackling challenging terrain.

Choose Your Line Wisely: Opt for the smoother path down the mountain, avoiding patches of exposed ice or heavy slush. For skiers, use your poles to test the surface and plan your route accordingly.

Mind the Weather Forecast: Keep and eye on the weather forecast before hitting the slopes. Knowing what conditions to expect allows you to plan accordingly.

Know When to Call it a Day: If conditions become too challenging, unsafe or, maybe you are getting tired, don't hesitate to switch to mellower terrain or call it a day. Safety comes first and there's no shame is choosing to enjoy the mountain in a way that makes sense to you.

Remember, communication is key. If you notice something or, have valuable insights into current conditions, share those with your teammates and leadership.
