
Incoming Onboarding & Schedule Reminder

She is the founder of EDGE Outdoors, a Black woman-led organization redefining who belongs in mountain spaces by creating pathways for Black, Indigenous, and Women of Color to access snow sports, outdoor leadership, and wellness. Annette's early life was shaped by invisible boundaries and systemic barriers—and rare moments of access that shattered them. These experiences seeded her unwavering belief that exposure is a catalyst for change. Annette is a 2024–2025 WISE Seattle Woman of Inspiration and serves on Ski California DEI Task Force, Snowsports Industries America's Inclusion Committee, and USHPA Women's Committee. With over a decade of experience uplifting marginalized communities and leading humanitarian work in Cuba and Tanzania, she is reshaping the narrative of who leads, who belongs, and who thrives in the wild.
